

DeRuyter Students Attend SADD Conference







Mental Health Minute: Think On Your Feet

Get out there and take steps this summer to improve brain health and feel good. Lace up your sneakers and hit the road! Walking helps:

- 1) New brain cells grow: proteins released during a walk cause new brain cell growth.
- 2) Enhances your mood: an increase in blood flow to the brain causes positive changes which make you feel good!
- Boosts your creativity: the simple act of walking enhances creativity due to an increase in oxygen in your blood.
- 4) Decrease stress damage: walking quiets the circuits responsible for stress and stress damage.
- 5) Reduces cognitive decline: taking at least 4000 steps per day increases brain tissue health.

Meet Our Mascot

From the School Health Office

Current Physical Exams: Current physical exams (dated 9/1/22 or more current) are required for all students entering grades PK, K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11. They are also required for any new entrants to the school, any student wishing to participate in sports or any student requesting working papers.

Immunizations: New York State Health and Education Laws require students entering certain grades to have certain immunizations. Please see below for required immunizations based on grade. Your child will need to have these immunizations BEFORE school begins in September. Failure to get these immunizations before the start of school could prevent your child from being allowed to attend school.

- Entering Kindergarten: 5th DTaP, 4th polio, 2nd MMR and 2nd Varicella
- Entering 6th Grade or by 11 years of age: Tdap
- Entering 7th Grade: Meningococcal
- Entering 12th Grade: 2nd Meningococcal

Hearing/Vision/Scoliosis Screenings: Hearing and vision screenings are required in PK, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th and 11th grades. Scoliosis screenings are required for boys in grade 9 and girls in grades 5 and 7. If these screenings are not completed by the healthcare provider at the time of the physical examination, they will be completed throughout the school year by the school nurse. Parents will be notified, via letter, of any abnormal results.

Medications: Any student requiring medications (including over the counter medications and/or self- carry/self-administer medications) during school hours will need to have a medication order signed by their healthcare provider. These forms can be found on the school website and need to renewed every school year.


