4 residents hospitalized.

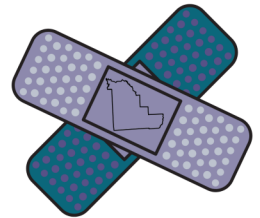
1.0% Madison County positivity rate. **1.5%** CNY Region positivity rate. **3.4%** NYS positivity rate.

Vaccine & Guideline Updates:

- Over 28,000 Madison County residents vaccinated! Let's keep up the good work!
- All New Yorkers 16 years of age and older are now eligible to receive a vaccine. Please note that Pfizer is the only vaccine currently approved for those who are 16 years of age. Moderna and Johnson & Johnson are currently approved for individuals 18 years and older.
- **Madison County has clinics scheduled throughout the month of April.** This includes 3 additional drive-thru clinics in Brookfield, Bridgeport and Georgetown. - According to NYS, 35.1% of NYS population has at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. In Madison County, 40.1% of the county's eligible population has at least one dose. For more information on statewide vaccination numbers, visit the [NYS Vaccine Tracker](#).
